Coalfield Site Gets Priority Treatment

After spending five years encouraging companies to locate into regeneration areas, Priority Sites - the property development company owned by The Royal Bank of Scotland plc and national regeneration agency English Partnerships - is doing the same.

Initially based in London and then Leeds, the company's offices have been relocated to Glasshoughton, West Yorkshire. A former coalmine and coking works, Glasshoughton forms part of English Partnerships' National Coalfields Programme and is being

developed in partnership with Waystone Ltd and regional development agency Yorkshire Forward.

Part of the site has been developed as a designer outlet village and some 200 new houses have been built. New factories and offices are also proving popular and a major ski centre is under construction. A rail halt is planned for late-2003 to complement the site's excellent road links.

Chief Executive Paul Barber believes the

new offices will make Priority Sites even more effective. "Virtually all our sites can be reached within half a day's travelling time. It's also good to be part of one of England's most impressive mixed-use regeneration schemes."
