Fosters comes to South Tyneside

Scottish & Newcastle plc, the FTSE 100 listed company and one of the UK's leading brewers, has announced a major new investment in the North East.

Monkton Business Park, Hebburn has been chosen by Scottish & Newcastle for a regional administration and distribution centre. The new facility – which is being developed by a team assembled by Priority Sites – will extend to 40,000 sq ft and will initially be home to 70 people, with hopes of more jobs as the business expands.

Priority Sites is working in partnership

with One North East and South Tyneside Council to attract more companies to the area. Chief Executive Paul Barber believes Scottish & Newcastle's decision is a real boost to those efforts. "It's great that a company of that stature has shown such a commitment to South Tyneside," he said. "I am sure that others will also see the benefits and decide to come here."

William Crawshay, regional manager of Scottish & Newcastle, believes the new facility will greatly improve his company's customer service.

"Monkton's convenient location close to the A194 trunk road and Priority Sites' innovative building design are ideally suited to our operational needs," he said. Priority Sites – the property development company owned by The Royal Bank of Scotland plc and national regeneration agency English Partnerships – has also built three detached factories on the park on a speculative basis which are now ready for immediate occupation.
